

# St Elizabeth's Catholic Primary School Sport Premium Spending 2020-2021

PE and Sport Premium Grant Received: £ 17,790

At St Elizabeth's we spend in excess of the allocated Sports Premium Grant on enhancing and sustaining quality PE and Sports provision. This report details the key aspects paid for by the accountable portion of Governmental funding. We report by the school year rather than financial year to maintain links with the School Learning Improvement/Development Plan.

Our school community continues to face a number of very significant barriers to learning, with the school situated in the top 7% of most deprived wards of the country. Our aim is to limit these barriers to learning and maximise opportunities for physical and health development to enable our child to access life-long sport and make improved and informed health related decisions as they grow older. We constantly seek links with supportive organisations and inside and beyond Coventry City and engage with a host of professional sports clubs to enrich, stimulate and engage the interest of all our children.

St Elizabeth's spends in excess of the allocated Sports Grant each year to improve outcomes for pupils in PE and Sport.
