Mathematics

Maths in Year 3 we follow the Power Maths mastery approach. This half term we are particularly focusing upon -

- Fractions
- ♦ Time
- Angles and properties of shapes.



- Regularly hear your child read, this can be their school reading book, class library book, or any other text they have at home.
- When hearing your child read ask them questions about the text, to ensure they understand what they are reading.
- Encourage your child to log in to Bedrock. This will support your child in learning new words and expanding their vocabulary.

At home, you can help by:

- ♦ Encourage your child to log on to TTrockstars. This will enable them to practice their times tables. In Year 3 we focus on learning the 3,4 and 8 times tables as well as practicing the 2, 5 and 10 times tables.
- Talk to your child about time, pointing out what the two hands are (hour and minute hand) and seeing if they can recognise the time when on the hour, half past, quarter past and quarter to.
- Encourage and support your child with the Maths homework given which makes links with the topic they are doing in school.

At school, we will learn: Our topic for this half term is Plants. This makes links with our Escape to the Country topic.

Science

We will find out about different types of plants, what each part of a plant is called and their functions. We will also discuss pollination and how plants reproduce.

- Take your child to weekly Mass or watch online and discuss what happens at each stage and why.
- ♦ Pray with your child.
- Read a child's bible with your child and discuss the stories.

At home, you can help by:

- Explore BBC bitesize with your child and discuss some of the key words related to the topic.
- Go on a walk and look for different flowers and plants, discussing their features.

Read the Weekly Word and weekly Children's liturgy sheets posted online and talk about the readings and Gospel accounts from each weekly mass.
